

Bathrooms

Bathrooms/, shower rooms and ensuites should be cleaned thoroughly. Don't forget the pipes behind toilets etc.

Begin by removing all hair and dust from floors and surfaces using a vacuum cleaner or dustpan and brush. This will make it much easier to clean as otherwise you end up just moving the dust around.

Spray and wipe all surfaces, bath, shower floors, tiles, sink etc with a bathroom cleaner to disinfect the surfaces. You may need a sponge scourer to remove soap scum.

In areas where there are watermarks, such as taps, sinks etc, use a descaling product designed to remove limescale. Don't forget to descale your shower head too.

Put some toilet cleaner (containing limescale remover) down the toilet, angling it around the rim to cover the whole toilet bowl. Leave for 10 minutes or so, then scrub with a toilet brush and flush.

Clean the toilet cistern, pedestal, flush handle, seat etc with an antibacterial spray.

Make sure that all silicone and grout is free from orange staining or mould. Use a mould remover containing bleach to return it to white. An old toothbrush can be a great tool for getting in between tiles.

Clean all windows and frames as above.

Mirrors should be cleaned with glass cleaner and left streak free.

Any furniture or fittings should be cleaned/disinfected.

Floors should be mopped, making sure to get behind sinks and toilets.
